

In addition to the talks held by various members of the school, the highlight of the programme had to be the fun Class Bonding games that were organised and conducted by the Peer Support Leaders!




Special Programmes


Cohort 1 and 2 English Oratorical Programme

This is an eight-hour Pratorical workshop for the Cohort 1 and 2 students. Students learn how to research, organise information, and make persuasive arguments. They can also learn to articulate their thoughts clearly, confidently, and persuasively. Students can tap on their interests in technology by using an Artificial Intelligence software to craft their speeches.

















The Conversational Chinese/Malay (CCM) Programme is an enrichment programme offered to the Cohort 1 students. During the CCM lessons, students can gain a deeper understanding and appreciation of the different cultures in Singapore.



The CCM Programme also provides opportunities for Canberrans to experience and immerse themselves in either conversational Chinese or Malay and practice what they have learnt in authentic settings.

Cohort Camps

Outdoor learning offers a holistic approach to education that goes beyond traditional classroom settings.
